Pas or's Page

You may have noticed a familiar furry face around the church lately.

Irving, my fluffy yellow cat, has been coming to church. He often comes with me in the morning, and occasionally in the evening. At the most recent Confirmation class, he sat on the back of the couch and enjoyed a lot of love from Rylie.

When the Harken family moved to Mattapoisett in 2011, we landed at the parsonage, which at that time was on Barstow Street, next to the church parking lot. In nice weather, our three cats hung out in the gravel lot, receiving pets and coos from teachers and COA visitors. Irving often trotted to the church, lurked by a door, and snuck in when the opportunity presented itself. He loved coming to church, whether I was there or not. He attended meetings of committees, recovery groups, and Girl Scouts. Of course, he also liked to hang out in the church office, or in my office.

In January 2016, we moved to the new parsonage on Abby Lane. The cats discovered they liked country living. It was difficult to get Irving into the car. He hated the 7-minute commute, and wasn't happy being at the church. The thrill was gone; he wanted to be in the big new house surrounded by trees.

This year we lost our other two cats. Olive, the calico, contracted a tumor in her belly, and we had her euthanized in July. (Many thanks to Dr. Phil Gaudet for his incredible compassion.) In November, we lost Edgar, our huge fluffy gray cat. We don't know the cause: one minute he was clamoring for his breakfast, per usual, a few moments later, he had passed away.

Edgar and Irving weren't litter mates, but came to us as a pair from a woman who rescues cats as her life's work. They were maybe a couple months old, and grew up together, as much as any feline ever "grows up."

After we lost Olive, Edgar and Irving were more vigilant about keeping tabs on each other. Sometimes they snuggled, but mostly just wanted to be in proximity. When Edgar died so suddenly and mysteriously, Irving wasn't sure what had become of his brother. He sniffed at Edgar's usual napping spots, sat on the deck waiting for Edgar to appear, and wandered the house calling out. We gave Irving treats, bought him special food, and generally coddled him in ways we had avoided in the past. Still, Irving roamed the house calling piteously. I thought maybe Irving needed something to take his mind off Edgar's absence. I brought him to church.

This time, Irving didn't resist the car ride. He didn't struggle when I carried him in the Mechanic Street door. When I set him on the floor in Reynard Hall, he trotted across it like he'd never left. Since then, Irving has loved coming to

church. Those who come and go tell him how handsome he is. He flops onto his back so people can rub his belly. He attends recovery group meetings, where he flirts shamelessly with everybody. He tries to help Bryan with projects from time to time, but seems to understand that Bryan is slightly allergic. So, when he's not napping in his basket on my desk or welcoming visitors, he hangs out with Tina, who plies him with treats.

At the parsonage, Irving is back to his old self. Every morning, he stands by the back kitchen door, eagerly meowing to "go see Tina." He jumps into the car at every opportunity, and doesn't understand when we <u>don't</u> go to church. Irving wants to go to church every day because it is so pleasant for him: He knows he's safe, that people love him, and will show him love in ways he likes (treats and belly rubs).

I like to think church can do this for all of us. In our toughest moments, when our world has turned upside down, can church be a place where we aren't just welcomed, but where we are fussed over? I hope so. And, not just fussed over, but treated like the special people we are. Where people go out of their way to remind us of our best qualities. A place where we can get back to our best selves, and, with loving support, to be the creatures God intended when God created us.

This Lent, let's commit ourselves to live by the Golden Rule, and treat every other human being in exactly the way we would want to be treated. If there's someone we haven't seen in a while, let's reach out. If someone is going through a tough time, let's make every effort to understand. Christ created his church to be a place of love, and support. It's up to each one of us to make that happen.

Please read this issue of the Tide-ings cover-to-cover. Exiting things are coming up for Lent to enrich your life, and increase the love within our community.

WomenSpirit is an intergenerational group, meeting the last Wednesday of every month, 5-6 p.m., in the Living Room in the basement. Our next few meetings are:



Faith Formation is planning a Monday evening movie series for Lent. Beginning on March 2, we will meet every Monday evening during the month of March from 6:30 -





April 12 ~ Easter Sunday


7 a.m. at the Gazebo in Shipyard Park. A Sunrise Service with coffee!




Ora et Labora-Socks of Love




