Collaborating with the Finance team as they make sure that our employees all continue to be paid with the assistance of the PPP Cares Act loan and initiating the upcoming Building Fund/Capital Campaign that will help to restore and renew our church & parsonage buildings. *Wow, let me take a breathe!*

A Prayer for Restoration


Dear Lord,
