A Walk of Faith

Trust in the Lord with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths.

Proverbs 3:5-6

A colleague told me a story that had both of us "quietly shouting" one midweek morning. Both this lady and her husband were employed; however, his job afforded no benefits (no vacation, no sick leave, etc.). If he didn't work, he didn't get paid. A minor injury left him out of work for a few weeks, leaving them with only her income. As if that wasn't enough, they had a major bill due within a couple of weeks. Their youngest child was going to college, and a payment was due. A regular tither, that Sunday morning this woman held her tithe in hand, written out in advance of arriving at church and thought about what she should do. She wondered if it was prudent for her to put the full tithe into the collection basket given her husband's condition and their bills. She talked about watching the collection basket get closer and closer to her row, and she said, "God, I trust you" and simply dropped her tithe into the basket.

I don't know if she cried in the pews that Sunday morning, but as she told me this story she teared up. And, honestly, even as I write about this now, I get misty-eyed.

A few days later, a family friend gave her a substantial check. Reportedly, she had not asked or complained about her situation, but the money came from the friend, "just because." Within a couple of days, her child received a call from the college awarding this student a scholarship. Note: the "payment that was due" had been cancelled! God has promised us children many things. Among them, are that our needs will be met in line with God's riches (Philippians 4:19).

Please note that the money was not of such a magnitude that she could quit her job, buy a mansion, or travel North America. But the finances that she received more than met the family's needs. The scholarship meant that the school bill simply went away. Eventually, her husband healed and returned to work and this lady of Christ continued on her faithfilled life's journey, having added one more piece of evidence of the faithfulness of God to her life and to mine.

A typical call and response for those of us in the Church are, "God is good...and all the time...God is good." This is an often-used call and response; however, will we really know if this is true if we fail to put God to the test (Malachi 3:10)? If we don't lean on our faith in God as we confront trials and tests, how will we really know that God is good? If she had not put the tithing check into the basket, who knows what would have happened? Probably, she would have felt guilty given her tithing history. But there are two points from this story that strike me.

First, it is important to be clear in our own minds about what constitutes faithful behavior. Sometimes, our friends and associates will give us an "easy landing," but not the right landing. A lot of us would have "understood" if she had decided to hold onto that tithe. I mean, after all, her husband was sick and had no income, and they still had bills.... Second, God works through people. The cynics among us might say that the family friend knew this family's financial situation and that God's goodness and her faithfulness were totally unrelated to either the love gift or the scholarship. However, God doesn't drop money from the sky like manna. Instead, God works through our circumstances and people. Tithing, as obedience to God, is a walk of faith. If the facts and circumstances of our lives are always evident, then faith is irrelevant. Faith, however, says:

"God, I don't know how You will work this out, but I have confidence in Your power and faithfulness. And, because I know You love me, I can leave this problem with You."

"God, You have already brought me a mighty long way; I believe You will continue to carry me the rest of the way."

"God, I trust You."
