Tasting notes:

Deep cherry-red colour. Ripe red and black fruit aromas with mineral hints and earthy notes coming through.

Full-bodied, lively and mouth-watering with a pleasant and silky mouthfeel.

Balanced and complex bouquet of fruity aromas combining with elegant tannins. Irresistible freshness with a charming mineral character emphasized by the French oak barrels.
