

- Our worship styles and formats speak to multiple generations.

• Our congregation offers many opportunities for all generations to serve together.

(Agree/Disagree/Not Sure)

Families talk about how faith impacts their financial decisions.

(Agree/Disagree/Not Sure)

• There is a sense that God is active and doing things in the life of this congregation. (Agree/Disagree/Not Sure)

My sense is that most congregations are challenged by how they welcome and affirm young people. (And by "young people" I mean anyone from infancy to young adulthood.) Truly, God is Still Speaking at St. Paul United Church of Christ—in the voices of our children and youth.

Letter to the editor

This past Sunday, my wife and I spent the weekend in your part of the state. We worshiped with St. Paul's in Bremen, and visited many of the shops, restaurants, and historic sites in and around New Bremen and St. Marys.

I just want to express to the entire community what a delight it was to visit your hometowns. Everywhere we went, we were treated with kindness and hospitality. The people we ran into were proud of their heritage and their history, and delighted us in talking about what it was like to grow up there. We learned a bit about life that stretched back through generations of families whose roots run deep in the county.

The Church we spent time at was especially kind and gracious. They talked to us about how committed they are to reaching out in kindness and love to all. The Rev. Becky Strang, pastor of St. Paul's, showed great courage and faith by making sure all who came to her doors would receive a warm welcome. If others receive the kindness and grace and hospitality we did, then it is no wonder their church is growing and there are so many active families and children

YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

Someone you know could be experiencing a mental illness or crisis. You can help them. You are more likely to encounter someone—friend, family member, coworker, neighbor, member of the community—in an emotional or mental crisis than someone having a heart attack. Mental Health First Aid teaches a 5-step action plan to offer initial help to people with signs and symptoms of a mental illness or in a crisis and connect them with the appropriate professional, peer, social or self-help care.

In response to the two young adult suicides in our area last fall, the Discipleship Team applied for a <u>Make a Difference Grant</u> from the United Church of Christ. We were granted funds to host Mental Health First Aid courses.

One course will focus on adult leaders, teachers, youth workers, parents—anyone who works with youth. A second course will focus on the mental health of adults.

St. Paul United Church of Christ will host its first Youth Mental Health First Aid Course from 8:00am-4:30pm on Saturday, October 13. All materials and lunch will be provided.


