MISSION TRIP

TO EL SALVADOR

(Articles Needed)

A delegation from St. Paul UCC New Bremen, traveling to El Salvador, will be leaving from the Dayton Airport on February 21 and will return on March 1, 2018. A total of eight reservations are available for this trip. Amy Scheer, Sharon Fiely, John and Joyce Gilberg will be representing St. Paul with four additional reservations available.

Two suitcases, per traveler, weighing up to fifty pounds each can be checked in at the airport. The hope is that all luggage will be filled with articles that the people of El Salvador need so very much.

We plan to pack these suitcases in the assembly room on February 16 at 6:00 p.m. If you are interested in helping, please come.

The following is a list of articles that can be used in El Salvador. It is a very warm climate. The people there are of smaller stature than we are in the states. Cotton or cotton-blend clothing is recommended. <u>Women</u> (in small villages) dresses, skirts, or blouses; (In the city) capris or jeans, skirts and blouses

Men - lightweight shirts, pants, and men's sandals

Little girls – dresses and cotton t-shirts

Little boys - shorts or lightweight long pants & cotton t-shirts

Teen-aged boys - jeans or lightweight long pants

<u>Teen-aged girls</u> - capris or jeans (NO shorts)

Infants – Baby clothing, lightweight blankets & sweaters

Lightweight jackets and sweaters for all ages

<u>Medical Supplies:</u> Bandages, sterile gauze, thermometers, tongue blades, medical tape, rubber gloves, masks, band aids, tooth brushes (NO MEDICATIONS)

<u>Toys for Boys</u> Match box or small toys. Soccer balls, air pumps and needles to pump up the balls

<u>Toys for Girls</u> Hair ribbons, bracelets, small purses, small dolls, pretty accessories

Toys for Babies Stimulation toys, small soft toys

Ball Caps Must be clean and in good condition

<u>School Supplies</u> Spanish books, spiral notebooks, pencils with erasers, large erasers, blunt scissors, centimeter rulers, crayons, coloring books, puzzles

Small Sample Soap, shampoo, conditioner, lotion (these are given at motels)

Household Items Towels, good sheets (twin & full sizes), shower curtains

<u>Sewing Supplies & Craft Items</u> Scissors, thread, & needles. At this time, no fabric is needed. A large donation was given.

Council President, Art Barnes called the meeting to order and opened with prayer. He also expressed thanks to the Sunday school children and staff for a very meaningful Christmas Program this am. No agenda presented for this meeting. The purpose of the meeting as follows:

- Voting on changes made by committee of council members regarding By-Laws and Constitution.
- Voting on new members of council for 2018
- Voting on Budget for 2018

<u>Constitution and By-Laws</u> – Church members present were presented with the changes that the committee had made. Art Barnes mentioned several of the more major changes in the Constitution and By-Laws that were made by the committee of council members and discussed by council. There was discussion and questions by congregation. Amy Scheer moved that one of the "Standing Committees of the Church Council" in section 5 should also be the "Discipleship Team". This should be added to By-Laws with amendment. Marlene Ahlers seconded this motion. This motion carried by "aye" vote. Vote was then taken to accept the changes made to the Constitution and By-Laws as amended. Motion carried by "aye" vote.

Acceptance of nominated Council members for 2018 - Council members nominated to date were listed in bulletin for the morning and presented to congregation. A vote was taken by "aye" vote and motion carried.

Budget for 2018 - Myra Hanenkratt presented the 2018 Budget proposal to the congregation. Members were provided with a written budget proposal.

- Total proposed budget \$375,153.00 with endowment income reducing the total to **\$332,911.00.**
- Total proposed budget with endowment income reflects a 7.32% increase from last year.

There was much question and answer. Concerns were regarding Sr. Pastor medical insurance coverage, Office Administrator Insurance and Pension, SALT program expense, and to overall find areas to cut expenses considering our added expenses of Associate Pastor. Concerns voiced regarding expenses vs. income\giving. Art Barnes did bring the budget to vote. At that time a motion was made by Tom Thieman to suspend the vote on the budget to allow Council and Budget committee to further consider the concerns that were voiced today. Vicki May seconded the motion. Motion carried by "aye" vote.

With this, the congregational meeting was adjourned with Benediction by Pastor Becky.
