DEMENTIA FRIENDS WORKSHOPS

Do you have a loved one in your life who lives with dementia? Are you a friend or caregiver to someone with memory loss? On Monday, September 17, the Area Council on Aging will lead two hour-long workshops for people who are family and friends of those with dementia. The course will be taught twice: at 3:00pm and again at 6:30pm in the Theatre Room. (Both workshops will have the same content.) These workshops are free and open to anyone in the community. All are welcome!

YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

Someone you know could be experiencing a mental illness or crisis. You can help them. You are more likely to encounter someone—friend, family member, coworker, neighbor, member of the community— in an emotional or mental crisis than someone having a heart attack. Mental Health First Aid teaches a 5-step action plan to offer initial help to people with the signs and symptoms of a mental illness or in a crisis and connect them with the appropriate professional, peer, social or self-help care.

In response to the two young adult suicides in our area last fall, the Discipleship Team applied for a Make a Difference Grant from the United Church of Christ. We were granted funds to host Mental Health First Aid courses.

One course will focus on adult leaders, teachers, youth workers, parents—anyone who works with youth. A second course will focus on the mental health of adults.

St. Paul United Church of Christ will host its first Youth Mental Health First Aid Course from 8:00am - 4:30pm on Saturday, October 13. All materials and lunch will be provided.



PROGRAM AIMS TO INCREASE DEMENTIA AWARENESS IN NEW BREMEN

A campaign to tackle the stigma and lack of understanding around dementia is underway with the support of St. Paul United Church of Christ.

St. Paul United Church of Christ is hosting two Dementia Friends Ohio Information Sessions on Monday, September 17 and invites the public to join in learning about Alzheimer's disease and other dementias, how to best support individuals and families who are impacted, and much more. Programs will be presented by Marty Williman, BSN, RN, Program Director, Ohio Council for Cognitive Health.

Dementia Friends is the biggest ever global initiative to change public perceptions of dementia. It aims to transform the way we think, talk and act about the disease. The Dementia Friends session helps you learn about dementia and the small ways you can help. From telling friends about the program to visiting someone you know living with dementia, every action counts.

Two 45-minute sessions will be offered on Monday, September 17 to accommodate busy schedules. The first session will begin at 3:00 p.m. and a repeat of this session will be offered at 6:30 p.m. Both sessions will take place at the church, 119 North Franklin St., New Bremen.

BUSY TWELVE NEWS

October 24, 1908

On the above date a group of children of the St. Paul Sunday School assembled in the Sunday School Building. The purpose of the gathering was to found a society to teach these little girls to quilt and sew and also become aware of mission work. Founders were: Mrs. C.G. Henninger, Mrs. Henry Luebkeman, Mrs. Adelia Froning, and Mrs. Wm. Klanke.

An explanation of plans and purposes of the society was made in English by pastor Henninger and Frau Luebkeman clarified it in Plattduetsch, whereupon an offering was lifted netting 97 cents.

The sewing circle grew in number and in 1923 Mrs. Froning suggested the name of the Busy 12 for the 12 teachers. By 1933 there were 96 children enrolled.

The children society was discontinued in 1953 due to lack of interest but the Busy 12 kept right on earning money to help missions. They served dinners and provided a lunch stand at house and farm sales.

Some of the Busy 12's special projects through the years were the purchase of the grand piano for the sanctuary in 1958 on their 50th anniversary (cost \$1844.50), purchase of refrigerator and stove for kitchen. A room was also furnished for the Auglaize School. In more recent years gifts are given to Agape, Crisis Center and Camp Washington at Christmas. Quilts are given to children who are baptized in our church. These quilts are made by our members. Members of our congregation residing in retirement homes are remembered with birthday, thinking of you and Christmas cards.

This year we celebrate our 110th anniversary. Meetings are still being held on the first Tuesday of the months September-May with devotions, lunch and sewing. Present members are: Sally Dicke, Diana Farno, Eileen Gamble, Ethel Mesloh, Cindy Newman, Eely Wenning, Dorothy Wilkins, Vernita Wellman and Edith Wissman. Honorary members are: Zelta Fogt and LaRue Dicke. Helpers include Kathy Nedderman, Rose Johnson and Melinda Clark. If interested in joining contact any of the above members.
