MISSION NEWS PRAYERS NEEDED FOR CHRISTIAN CHAVARRIA

Christian Chavarria is in need of our prayers. He, his friend, Aldo, and Aldo's mother, Fina have been targeted by a gang in San Salvador, El Salvador. Their lives have been threatened unless Christian pays them \$5000. These gangs are ruthless and do what they say they will do if they are not paid. They warned Christian not to call the police but he did anyway. They then threatened to kill Aldo's mother unless \$1000 was paid. Christian managed to raise that money to save her. The police are looking for the perpetrator who caused this disastrous deed. In the meantime, Christian and Aldo have moved to another part of the city until decisions are made as to whether to stay and risk death at the hands of the gang or to leave for another country for several months. They are hoping that the police can catch the gang members who are threatening them. Christian wants to stay as he has so much work to do to help his people in that country. He is to be ordained as a minister in the Lutheran Church in August and is pastor of a small church in Calderitis, which is thriving under his leadership. He is responsible for the planning of the church services in the Resurrection Church each Sunday. This is the church that our congregation donated \$20,000 to help place a roof on its top two years ago.

Many of you have met and know Christian. Those, who have gone on mission trips, know him well. Just this past fall, he showed the youth in our church how to paint and the following week, he told his life story. Search Google for Voices of El Salvador Christian Chavarria.

Please keep praying for the safety of Christian, Aldo and Fina. Prayers are so needed at this time. Also, pray for all those who are targeted by the gangs and who run for their lives to find sanctuary in our country. They do not want to leave their country but must if they want to live.

PASTOR BECKY'S REPORT

VITAL VINTAGE CHURCH (THREE AND FOUR)

Bringing Worship into the 20th Century

- 1. Key to revitalization is worship.
- 2. "I am completely convinced that weekly communion is something every church should pondersimply reclaiming more fully this vintage sacrament will lead to church renewal by itself." (22)
- 3. "Take traditional (vintage" elements of worship and infuse them with new life, meaning and energy." (26)
- 4. Importance of music in worship.
- 5. Questions to ask when crafting a worship service:
 - a. What do we want people to feel in this service?
 - b. What visual images should they take away?
 - c. What should they smell or taste?
 - d. What do we want them to hear replaying throughout the week?
 - e. What kind of experience are you trying to craft?
 - f. Who do you want them to be as a result?
 - g. What do we want people to go out and do as a result of having worshiped God?
- 6. Importance of visual art in worship, including televisions/monitors.

Structured for a Wiki World

- 1. "We must stop having meetings, at least in the ways we always have...During my first four years at Virginia-Highland Church the congregation more than quadrupled in size, but the number of meetings we held was reduced by three-fourths. The parish council does at least 75 percent of their work via email and gathers less frequently for shorter meetings. The important work gets done at meetings open to everyone following worship. They don't have to sit through reports that could have been read at home, but they can be invited to engage in the vision and mission of the church. Early on, the council adopted an agenda with three items: finances, facilities, and future. The agreement was to spend 50 percent of our time talking about the future and never to meet for more than 90 minutes." (53-54)
- 2. "In a system in which vision and mission are owned and actualized, many decisions have already been made...Because our vision and mission have been established by the congregation, they already have given us our marching orders, and the work of leadership is implementation. (55)
- 3. "The leaders of a local church are free to make decisions and respond in innovative ways when they are clear about the direction, purpose and guiding values." (56)
- 4. "If we want to be an agile church, we must adapt an attitude that empowers people to make decisions based on the vision and mission that the church has approved already." (59)
