MAY'S MONTHLY MISSION: UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST DISASTER RELIEF

Throughout the month of May, our designated monthly mission will go toward disaster relief efforts within our denomination.

In 2005, immediately following Hurricane Katrina, the UCC Disaster Relief Team sent Pastor Becky to Houston, Texas to coordinate relief efforts among the area UCC churches as busloads of folk from New Orleans were arriving daily. After three weeks in Houston, Becky wrote a rough draft job description for the person who would ultimately be hired fulltime to coordinate relief efforts in Houston and New Orleans.

Wherever natural disaster strikes, the United Church of Christ is present—offering immediate assistance as well as the long term work of rebuilding.

Your generous giving to May's monthly mission will ensure that those whose lives are impacted by disasters will have shelter, food, and hope.

AGAPE MINISTRIES

<u>Secretary's Report:</u> Secretary's Report reviewed. Mimi Messick made a motion. Tom Brandewie seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Treasurer's report, as of March 2019, was reviewed with a (\$11,191.00) deficit. Mimi Messick moved to accept Treasurer's report as read. Roland Dicke seconded the motion. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Mission:</u> Patty Hamilton – CEO from Agape shared opportunities, we can create together, regarding the Blessing Cabinet and providing care packages to the youth. Agape is no longer keeping tons of extra stock on site. They are trying to do more outreach within the community. We are excited to partner with them.

<u>Art Camp:</u> Everything is going smoothly. Lots of ideas are being generated on this committee. Very excited for June!

MAINTENANCE REPORT

John Mohrman reports:

- Performed weekly and monthly preventive maintenance checks.
- Working with trustees and wheelchair lift inspector to upgrade wheelchair lift to be more user friendly.
- Showed an insurance company representative around the facility for an inspection.
- Building shelving and creating a storage area in the boiler room for maintenance type items currently stored in general office supplies and storage area.
- A Vectren inspector was called in due to a foul odor in the kitchen. A very small leak was found behind the stove. Some of the current piping is galvanized and will need replaced in order to be brought up to code. Will schedule New Knoxville Supply.
- Met with trustees.

PASTOR BECKY'S REPORT

VITAL VINTAGE CHURCH (CHAPTERS FIVE AND SIX)

Chapter Five: Removing "Lead" from Leadership

Churches should write into their pastor's contract the requirement to have 12 failures a year. (62)

I am simply advocating for church leaders to boldly explore new fields and learn new skills. The Vintage Church needs to "plug into" the smartphone and all the other tools that people are using and by which they are being shaped. (65)

Chapter Six: Finding Our Voice

The "y'all come" approach taken by most Vintage Churches is ineffectual. We must discern who we are called to be (vision), what we are called to do (mission), and what our guiding core values are. Then we must find our voice and articulate what we have discerned, and we must do it clearly, passionately, creatively, and relentlessly. (70-71)

You don't need to convince everyone; in fact, you don't really need to convince anyone. All you really need do is let those who already need you and agree with you find you. Our greatest challenge as

progressive, inclusive, and mainline churches may be to give up the middle of the road where we seem determined to offend no one and therefore end up saying nothing with much resolve or conviction. (71)

Vintage Churches must rediscover the voice of our ancestors who spoke loudly, clearly and consistently for religious freedom at the founding of the country, against slavery when our nation was sorely divided, for the rights of women, against racial segregation, for LGBT equality, for the healing of the earth, for economic quality, etc. (71)

The one principle most marketers urge us to remember is that someone must encounter our name/identity seven or eight times before it really has an impact. You must be prepared to fail and then try again and again. (72)

Our pews will remain more empty than full unless we can find our prophetic voice and speak clearly and passionately to the multiple crises of our day. (75-76)
