

Bookmark Designs and Book Related Colouring entries for our Library WBD Competitions. The winners have been awarded prizes and certificates for the best




efforts. The winning entries and a selection of the students work is on display in the library.

On Wednesday 7th March, the RE groups, along with Mrs Nasir and Mr Leak, visited St. Edward's Church.


During our visit to the Church, we observed and paid attention to what the Priest told us, guiding us around the Church with his words; describing each feature of the Church in great detail. He even told us some amazing history about it.

Once we entered the Church, we were already intrigued and fascinated at the beautiful architecture and structure. As we walked inside and entered the main prayer area, we saw pews along both sides of the Nave. This is where the congregation would sit and pray together.

We saw many features of the Church and learned about the significance of these for Christians. Along the walls of the Church, there were 14 Stations of the Cross which describe the moments before the crucifixion of Jesus.

We learned of the significance of the Altar table and how it was a reminder of the Last Supper of Jesus with his disciples. We had the opportunity to enter the confession box and see where the priest stores the vestments. The Church features which we had only seen in pictures, came to life when we set foot in the Church.


This made it more exciting and interesting for us as a group.

In swimming lessons on Monday 19th March and Wednesday 21st March pupils were given the challenge of trying to swim as far as they could.



Critical thinking skills were used to consider different perspectives and develop understanding of the causes and solutions to the challenge of gender inequality in different contexts.

This week members of our Equality and Diversity Council along with Head Girls and Prefects, were able to Skype call students from Millenial Academy. Science Club





Girls at Selly Park have developed internet school rules to coincide with Safer Internet Day including "We never give out personal information online" and we never arrange to meet someone we do not know. The below poster is displayed in every classroom.

School Rules When Using The Internet

- 1. We send e-mails that are polite and friendly
- 2. We never give out personal information online
- We do not accept emails or IM messages from people we do not know, or download files without asking permission, any of these could contain viruses or nasty messages.
- 4. We never arrange to meet someone we don't know
- 5. We do not use chat rooms
- 6. We do not look at inappropriate websites, if one is accidentally opened we close it immediately.
- 7. If something happens online that makes us feel uncomfortable we report it immediately to our teacher or trusted adult.
- 8. We never reveal our password to anyone and change it regularly

A trip down memory lane - Selly Park School Reunion



Mrs Darwood, Mr Clinton and Mrs Bowker were delighted to be invited to a Selly Park School reunion on Friday, 23rd March. Organised by Jeanne Glen, ex pupils from across South Birmingham gathered at Christ Church, on Pershore Road, to share stories and memorabilia from their time at the School. Irene Bennett and Gillian Hill told the guests that the school opened in 1911. However, within a decade it was used for a very different purpose as it was utilised as a military hospital during World War One. At this time, it was a mixed school and housed infants and juniors as well as senior pupils. Fascinatingly, the School was actually bombed during World War Two, and the pupils had to attend school at a different location. By 1955, the school reflected the present intake and taught exclusively girls between the ages of eleven and sixteen.

Mrs Darwood had the opportunity to meet Margaret Clarke (nee Gibbon), a former home economics teacher. Mrs Clarke worked at the school during 1960-1964 and then enjoyed a second stint between 1989 and 1997. The next reunion will take place in the School, where alumnae will have the opportunity to have a tour around the school and enjoy an afternoon tea in the new Ann Rae building. 
