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
Art Department News


Our Governors were awarded with an ambassador award for thinking about Rights during this important planning day. Thank you for asking us along Mrs Darwood!

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


Olive Academies Partnership

Visit to Birmingham Library







Smoothing the Path from Primary to Secondary Transition

Selly Park have forged well-established links with local primary schools, working collaboratively with staff and pupils to embed effective communication. We also share our facilities with local primary schools: a good example being the Year 5 days which are run annually. This means many pupils know the school well before they join us. We have an experienced transition team who meet our new intake pupils at their primary school, once they have made their choice to join Selly Park. As part of these visits there is an open "question and answer" session which the new intake students find very helpful to reduce worries and show the exciting school life our students experience. During the official Induction Day in July, they are given a full day of taster lessons and activities. We also spend some time with parents on this day welcoming them to our school and reassuring them if they have any concerns. The transition is supported by a fully funded Summer School, which provide a wonderful opportunity for new pupils to get to know the school, some of their new teachers and make new friends. Summer School is held over the summer holiday and delivers sessions in a fun and exciting way. This year students will experience a diverse rotation of subjects including Art, PE and Science as well as attend an exciting day retreat climbing, bouldering and caving.

The new intake students are looked after by staff and student mentors, so that they are made welcome in their new school and have any anxieties or queries dealt with. If a pupil is the only one joining Selly Park from a feeder school, she is offered a Selly Park student as a buddy who is available to offer support.

In the Autumn term, we hold a "Progress Day" where parents/guardians can meet with daughter's form tutor and discuss how they have settled in and deal with any concerns which may have arisen. We are aware that first impressions are very important, and we make every effort to enable our new students to start their secondary school phase in a relaxed and happy atmosphere.
