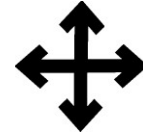

ST. PAUL UCC COUNCIL MEETING

JULY 9, 2019

The meeting was called to order by President Jeff Quellhorst with council members including: Roland Dicke, Dee Schroer, Andrea Huber, John Mohrman, Tom Brandewie, John Gilberg, Mimi Messick and Morgan Felver. Devotions were provided by Morgan Felver.

Secretary's Report: Secretary's Report reviewed. A correction was needed to change quote, for AC w/heating system, from \$30,000 to \$38,000. Tom Brandewie made a motion to accept report as corrected. John Gilberg seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer's report, as of June 2019, was reviewed with a deficit of (-\$11,439.05) in the General fund. Mimi Messick moved to accept Treasurer's Report as read. Tom Brandewie seconded the motion. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Mission: This Sunday's service will be outside, and immediately after worship there will be an ice cream social to support the Project of the Year. Upcoming events are July: Backpacks, August: Crossroads, September: Local Aide.

Worship: Help is needed to set up chairs for the outside service on 7/21/19. No other report.

Finance: Next meeting - date pending

Playground: Hopeful for a September dedication date. More info to follow.

Art Camp: Received a nice thank you note from a Homan family. The week went fantastic. 241 children registered. Over 100 volunteers throughout the week.

Salt: This month we have continued to check many items off our “to-do list”! We have attended home visits with Anna Louise and plan to continue doing so during our last month. Last week we sent out “Thinking of You” cards to people on the Pastoral Care list. Pastor Becky asked that we deliver cookies, to those we visited, at least once while she was away. Yesterday we made gingersnap cookies and plan to deliver them this week. This will be the second time SALT interns have been in touch with our Pastoral Care folk. Tatum, Katie, and I are continuing to work on bulletins for the months of July, August, and the first part of September. They are just about finished, only a couple left to do! Over the course of the next three weekends, in July, all three of us will be giving the Children’s Moment during Sunday worship services: Tatum - July 14, Morgan - July 21, Katie - July 28. We are excited to share with the children what we have planned! Tatum is finishing up St. Paul brochures, and we hope to get those distributed soon. With the summer months upon us, we know that the sanctuary can get quite warm on Sunday mornings, so we are working to create fans to place throughout the pews for people to use to keep themselves cool. These fans will have different information on them, such as the yearly mission, blessing cabinet information, joining St. Paul contact information, etc. If there are any other important events or information that you think we could include, feel free to let us know and we will gladly add more. If you take a walk up to the craft room, you will notice that it is nice and organized! It was a long day, but we went through and labeled and organized the craft room so that it will be easier for everyone to find the materials they need. The Blessing Cabinet tags are ready for the month of July, and we are working to get the bulletin board back up on the door where they hang. It was taken down during the move, and needed a little “TLC” to get it looking nice again. Morgan is also contacting Grandpa Allen to see if we can get the back of the Blessing Cabinet door painted, as some of the paint has fallen off. Morgan is working on redoing the bulletin boards in the hallways, and if all goes well, hopes to have them all done by the end of next week. Our final big

event will take place next Wednesday, as we will be hosting our Senior Luncheon from noon to one. We are hoping for a good turnout. During the luncheon our summer youth group will be helping serve lunch and will be providing entertainment. We look forward to another month of fellowship and fun with everyone!
