She is known for speaking up about local issues and has advocated for early voting at Seminole State College, sensible housing prices, the rural boundary, and protection for the Econlockhatchee River. Deborah served as a volunteer with Seminole County schools and is a member of the Longwood Charter Advisory Committee. She is affiliated with the Democratic Party and was the Activist of the Month in August 2019.

Deborah has lived in Seminole County for nearly 30 years. Her sons, Joshua and Jacob, graduated from Lyman High School and attended the University of Florida. Deborah's favorite hobbies are hiking, kayaking, and digging for fossils.

1. Early voting at Seminole State College
2. Prepaid postage for vote by mail
3. More than the minimum for early voting hours
4. Equal access to Spanish information
5. Voting rights for those with felonies in their past
6. Fair and neutral voter information
7. Fair and neutral polling places
8. More voter education in high school
9. Respect for poll watchers
10. Accurate and transparent data
11. Clean and accurate voter rolls
12. Strong election security
