#### **Celebrate LGBT History Month in October!**

On Thursday October 3, from 7 PM to 9 PM, the LGBT Center's Women's Group will host a program on LGBT History at their regular monthly meeting at the LGBT Center, 1306 N. Third Street, Harrisburg. Come hear Lonna Malmsheimer and Nancy Datres from the History Project, and Tameca Waid and Monique Pearson, former owners of Forever Books (an LGBT Bookstore that was located in Steelton), share their interesting herstories.

On Thursday October 24, from 6 PM to 8 PM, the History Project will host a Story Circle at the regular monthly meeting of Aging with Pride at the LGBT Center, 1306 N. Third Street, Harrisburg. Come listen to our narrators about early LGBT organizing efforts through the creation of the PA Rural Gay Caucus and other organizations in central and eastern PA, as well as recollections of an owner of several gay bars in Harrisburg, and share your own memories.

There will be an exhibit of archival materials that have been donated to the History Project at the Dickinson College Archives, located in the Waidner-Spahr Library at 333 West High Street between College and Cherry Streets in Carlisle during the month of October. The Dickinson library is open to the public from 8 am to 6 pm Monday through Friday and from 10 am to 6 pm Saturday and Sunday. ## Interviewer training scheduled for Sept. 28

Would you like a front row seat to hear about the history of our local LGBT community? Discover stories of extraordinary lives as an interviewer of people who have helped create that history.

The History Project will hold training for new potential interviewer volunteers, and refresher training for current interviewer volunteers, on Saturday September 28 from 9 AM to 3 PM at the LGBT Center of Central PA, 1306 N. Third Street, Harrisburg, PA.

The training will cover an introduction to the History Project, oral history interviewing techniques, a review of the updated interview questionnaire and other forms and documents we use in our project, selecting narrators (interviewees) off the waiting list and scheduling interviews, how to reserve, set up and run the video equipment for interviews, the process for documenting and receiving archival/artifact donations from narrators, and other related topics. Lunch, beverages and snacks will be provided. There is no charge for the training.

Our interviewers work in teams of two people - one person to conduct the interview and ask questions, and one person to run the video camera, monitor sound levels and create an interview log. You may volunteer to do either of these roles once you are trained.

Once you complete the training, we will ask for a commitment from you that you will participate in a minimum of three oral history interviews over a six month period following the training. Each interview takes on average approximately two to three hours, including equipment set up/take down, plus travel time to the interview location. We currently have a waiting list of more than 60 people who want to be interviewed, and more are being added all the time. Please do not sign up for this training unless you are prepared to make this commitment.

We also strongly recommend all interviewer volunteers view the documentary films *Before Stonewall* and *After Stonewall* before interviewing narrators to provide you with some national LGBT historical context for the interviews. We will be arranging for a showing of these documentaries on a date separate from the training session for optional viewing, or you may be able to obtain them from your local library or movie rental service for viewing on your own.

#### History Project outreach efforts successful

The History Project made a very successful showing with a booth at the Lancaster Pride Festival and Central PA Pride Festival in Harrisburg. About 30 people signed up to be narrators and/or volunteer to help with various aspects of the History Project.

About 25 people attended another event, "Memories of Pride" on July 25 at the LGBT Center with refreshments, information and displays about the History Project. A few people did mini-interviews to share their first pride event memories, or their most memorable pride moments from the past, and several people brought in old pride t-shirts, buttons, photographs and other memorabilia.

# **Archival procedures finalized**

Procedures have been developed for receiving archival and artifact donations for the History Project, to be documented, catalogued and housed at the Dickinson College Archives. An information flyer is now available to provide guidelines on how to prepare donations and a gift of deed/accession record form is now available and should be included with all archival or artifact donations.

As a reminder to interviewers, please ask your narrators if they have any archival or artifact materials that they wish to donate to the Project. We will be adding these flyers and forms to the camera kits.

#### Summer fundraiser a big success

A successful fundraiser garden party was held at the beautiful residence of Larry and Jeff in Mechanicsburg on August 22. More than \$1000 was raised, including \$755 for the History Project and \$250 for other Aging with Pride programs.

The current balance of our funds available in account is \$1,918.67.

The Fundraising Team is working on a couple of grant applications and discussing a possible fundraising house party this winter.

### **Interns assisting with History Project**

As we say goodbye and thank you to Sarah Radomsky, our summer intern from Georgetown University who assisted on several interviews, we welcome a fall intern, Mana Shaw, a student at Dickinson College. Mana will be working on the exhibit at Dickinson College Archives for LGBT History Month, transcribing some of our completed interviews, and some outreach activities.

We also have sent internship availability notices to more than 250 contacts at colleges throughout Pennsylvania for fall or spring semester unpaid internships. We met recently with two professors at Elizabethtown College are strongly encouraging students to get involved with the History Project.

## **Narrator list progress**

We completed interviews of 19 narrators (interviewees) while more than 60 narrators are waiting to be interviewed. We have 12 interviewers still on the active list. We no longer have an Interview Team coordinator, but are using Drop Box to facilitate the interviewer volunteers' access to the narrators list. If you are a volunteer interviewer, please be sure to access this Drop Box spreadsheet, and select the narrators you want to contact to interview by entering your name in the interviewer column. You should then contact other volunteer interviewers to find a camera person to work with you and contact the narrator to schedule the interview. Contact the LGBT Center to schedule the camera kit. Please complete these interviews as soon as possible to keep from having our narrators wait too long to share their stories, and update the Drop Box spreadsheet to let us know when an interview is complete. If you are having problems accessing the Drop Box file, contact Barry.
