Indiana's only multicultural reporter, Katiera Winfrey, will also take a deeper dive into community reaction to the culture of crime in the Circle City.

"What can be done to curb the rising number of murders? What can the city do? How can citizens help?" asked Al Carl, news director for WISH-TV. "These are the kinds of questions we're hoping to address in this forum. Additionally, we're asking viewers to submit their questions and concerns as well. We won't find the answers in one hour, but we're hoping this can be a catalyst toward real solutions in the city."
