ACPB PRIVACY POLICY

The Association of Corporate Pro Bono ("The Association of Corporate Pro Bono," "ACPB," "our", "us" or "we") provides this Privacy Policy to inform you of our policies and procedures regarding the collection, use and disclosure of personal information that ACPB receives from users of our website, accessible at www.acpbinc.org (the "Site").

This Privacy Policy is hereby incorporated in our Terms & Conditions ("Terms"), accessible at www.acpbinc.org/Terms. By accessing or using the Site, you are agreeing to be bound by the Terms and understand that the Terms shall constitute a binding and enforceable contract between you and us, regardless of whether you are a Member or simply, accessing, browsing or in any way using the Site and Services.

Unless otherwise defined in this Privacy Policy, terms used in this Privacy Policy have the same meanings as those terms defined in our Terms. As used in this Privacy Policy, the terms "using" and "processing" information include using cookies on a computer, subjecting the information to statistical or other analysis and handling information in any way, including, but not limited to, using, evaluating, collecting, modifying, deleting, combining, storing, disclosing and transferring information within our organization or among our affiliates within and outside of the United States.

NOTIFICATION OF CHANGES

ACPB may, in its sole discretion and at any time, modify this Privacy Policy, in whole or in part. We will notify you of any material changes by posting the revised privacy policy on the Site. Unless otherwise provided, the new and/or revised terms of this Privacy Policy will take effect immediately upon posting to the Site. Once any changes become effective, your continued use of the Site after such time will signify your acceptance of the new and/or revised terms. You are advised to consult this Privacy Policy regularly for any changes.

INFORMATION COLLECTION AND USE

Our primary goals in collecting information are to (i) provide and improve our Site and Services, including, but not limited to, the services, features, and content contained therein; (ii) administer your use of the Site and Services; and (iii) enable you and other users to access, enjoy and easily navigate the Site and Services.

PERSONALLY IDENTIFIABLE INFORMATION

When you submit an application with us through the Site to become a Member or elect to receive emails or other communications from ACPB, we will ask you for personally identifiable information. This refers to information about you that can be used to contact or identify you ("Personal Information"). Personal Information includes, but is not limited to, your name, email address, post address, and credit card or other billing information.

The Site does not track, collect, or distribute Personal Information, except when such information is specifically and knowingly provided by you. Thus, we will only collect Personal Information when such information is intentionally transmitted to ACPB by you. Our use of any such Personal Information shall be in accordance with applicable laws, rules, and regulations.

We also use your Personal Information to contact you with ACPB newsletters, marketing or promotional materials and other information that may be of interest to you. If you decide at any time that you no longer wish to receive such communications, you can opt-out of certain communications by following the unsubscribe instructions provided in any of the communications or by sending an unsubscribe request from the e-mail address at which you are receiving the messages to acpb@acpbinc.org.

LOG DATA

When you visit the Site, whether as a user or a Member, our servers automatically record information that your browser sends whenever you visit a website ("Log Data"). This Log Data may include information such as your computer's Internet Protocol ("IP") address, browser type or the webpage you were visiting before visiting our Site, pages of our Site that you visit, the time spent on those pages, information you search for on our Site, access times and dates, and other statistics. We use this information to (i) monitor and analyze use of the Site and the Service and for the Site's technical administration; (ii) increase our Site's functionality, accessibility, and user-friendliness; and (iii) improve and better tailor it to our users' needs.

COOKIES AND OTHER TECHNOLOGIES

ACPB may store some information on your computer when you access the Site. This information is commonly known as a "Cookie" and once recorded is not accessible by any other company. We use Cookies in order to better understand how the Site is being accessed and used and Cookies also help us to determine if the Site is being delivered efficiently. In addition, Cookies allow us to enhance your online experience by customizing your use of the Site and eliminating the need for you to reenter data every time you visit the Site. The use of Cookies is an industry standard and is used by most major websites to provide the visitor with tailored information. Should you wish to block these Cookies in the first instance or erase them from your computer after they have been recorded, please consult your computer manual. If you block or erase these Cookies you may limit the functionality available to you on the Website. ACPB may also track user behavior on the Site. This information is used to enhance ACPB's ability to provide the best experience possible to users, and is not provided to third parties for commercial or other purposes.

INFORMATION SHARING AND DISCLOSURE

ACPB will not knowingly sell or distribute Personal Information to third parties for their marketing purposes. To the extent ACPB uses third parties to provide specific services or information to you, those third parties may be allowed to use your Personal Information to provide such services. ACPB may share collected Log Data with affiliates, contractors and other third parties.

Within ACPB, your Personal Information will be transmitted and stored in a protected environment. ACPB will use commercially reasonable efforts to shield your Personal Information from any third parties other than those that have been engaged by ACPB to provide services to you, or for which you have been notified and provided your consent. You hereby agree and consent that, in certain circumstances, ACPB may share Log Data and/or Personal Information when ACPB believes it is necessary to comply with the law, court order, to protect against misuse or unauthorized use of the Site and the Service or to protect the rights, property or safety of ACPB's interests or its customers. This may include sharing information with other companies, lawyers or government agencies in connection with fraud protection and credit risk reduction or investigating reports of users using a false email address or users sending or posting harassing, threatening, or abusive messages or other issues related to fraud or government subpoenas, warrants and/or court orders.

In the event that some or all of the business assets of ACPB are sold or transferred, any information gathered by ACPB through the Site may be transferred along with the business assets.

CHANGING OR DELETING YOUR INFORMATION

All Members may review, update, correct or delete the Personal Information in their Accounts by visiting the "My Profile" section of the Site, or by contacting us at acpb@acpbinc.org. If you would like to close or delete your Account, please contact us at acpb@acpbinc.org. However, we may continue to display your Member Content in situations in which it implicates or affects other users, and we may also retain an archived copy of your records as required by law or for legitimate business purposes.

SECURITY

Although we make efforts to protect your personal information, ACPB does not guarantee the security of any information you transmit to ACPB or provide online. ACPB requests that you do not send, and ACPB will not be liable for your sending, sensitive or confidential information electronically. It is possible that other users or unauthorized "hackers" may post or transmit offensive or obscene materials on the Site and that you may be involuntarily exposed to such materials. It may also be possible for other users or "hackers" to obtain personal information about you. By using the Site, you assume the risk of such occurrences.

INTERNATIONAL TRANSFER

Your information may be transferred to, and maintained on, computers located outside of your state, province, country or other governmental jurisdiction where the privacy laws may not be as protective as those in your jurisdiction. If you are located outside the United States and choose to provide information to us, ACPB transfers Personal Information to the United States and processes it there. Your consent to this Privacy Policy followed by your submission of such information represents your agreement to that transfer.
